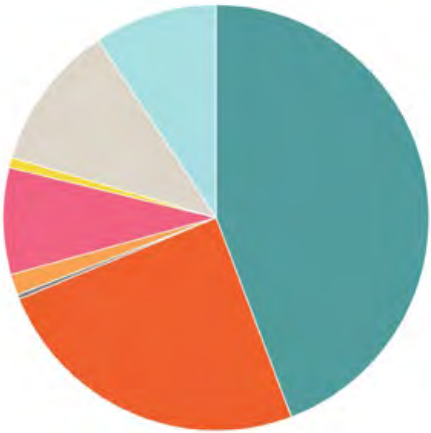
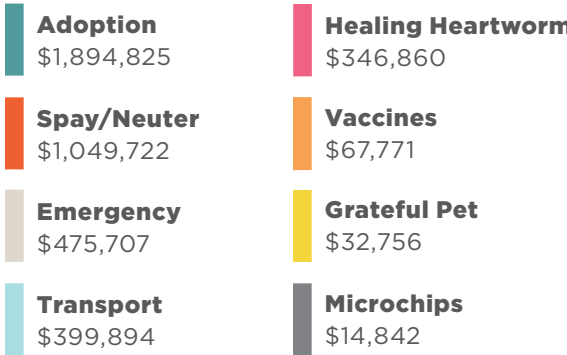


BISSELL Pet Foundation Grants

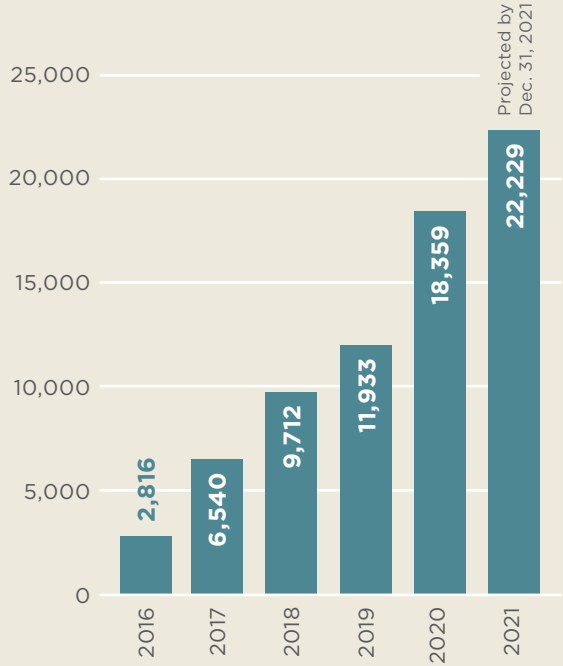


ETS Success for Seniors

Belky was adopted during a special Empty the Shelters in August 2021, featuring cats, large dogs and seniors. This 15-year-old Australian shepherd mix was covered in maggot-filled puncture wounds after being abandoned on a Michigan highway. She was morbidly obese and unable to walk from an uncontrolled thyroid issue. Saginaw County Animal Care and Control took her in and got her healthy before her transfer to the Humane Society of Midland County. Just a few days later, Belky’s new owner adopted her, committing to spoiling her endlessly for the rest of her days.

“I might not have her long, but I’m going to make sure every day she has is the best day.” said Belky’s new owner Breanna Dalton.

Changing Communities through Empty the Shelters

Children Know Adoption is the Best Option

Time after time, it’s the children leading their parents to adopt. After weeks of asking his dad to adopt a cat, Parker’s family stopped into the City of Cabot Animal Shelter in Arkansas “just to take a look” during the July Empty the Shelters. Immediately, Parker had love at first sight with a little kitten, and with very little convincing, he took his new kitten Millie home. Since then, the two have been inseparable, with Millie always at Parker’s side, napping on the sofa while he plays video games. Millie even cuddles with the two dogs in the house! Thanks to our ETS event, Parker and Millie will live a long, happy, snuggly life together.

ETS Alum Eastwood: Then & Now

In early 2017, Eastwood was found wandering in the cold Michigan winter, limping and nearly blind. Little Traverse Bay Humane Society knew he needed adopters who could address his medical issues. Sadly, he was the only dog left in the shelter after the May ETS, but thanks to internet fame, Eastwood caught the eye of the Van Gundys.

From day one, Eastwood’s new family loved him and ensured he received the best medical care, including eye surgery and a supportive orthotic for his crooked leg, allowing him to be a playful pup. When his family moved from Michigan to Florida, Eastwood settled right into the sunny new location, where he lounges by the lake, enjoys car rides, and cuddles with his family. Thank you to the Van Gundy family for saving Eastwood and giving him the life he deserves!

Transport: A Lifeline for Second Chances

This past year, BPF hit the road in more ways than one as we expanded our transport program from ground efforts to include air transports. Utilizing chartered cargo planes, we arrange flights for homeless pets to shelter and rescue partners waiting to find them loving homes. Adding air transport allowed us to move more pets longer distances and faster, making cross-country trips in a few hours instead of a few days, which is less stressful for the dogs and cats on the move. **So far this year, 4,767 pets were transported through our collaborative efforts to both relieve overcrowded shelters and aid our emergency disaster response.** One of our most memorable flights was also one for the record books - in July, we embarked upon the longest transport in BPF history, flying pets from El Paso to Canada!

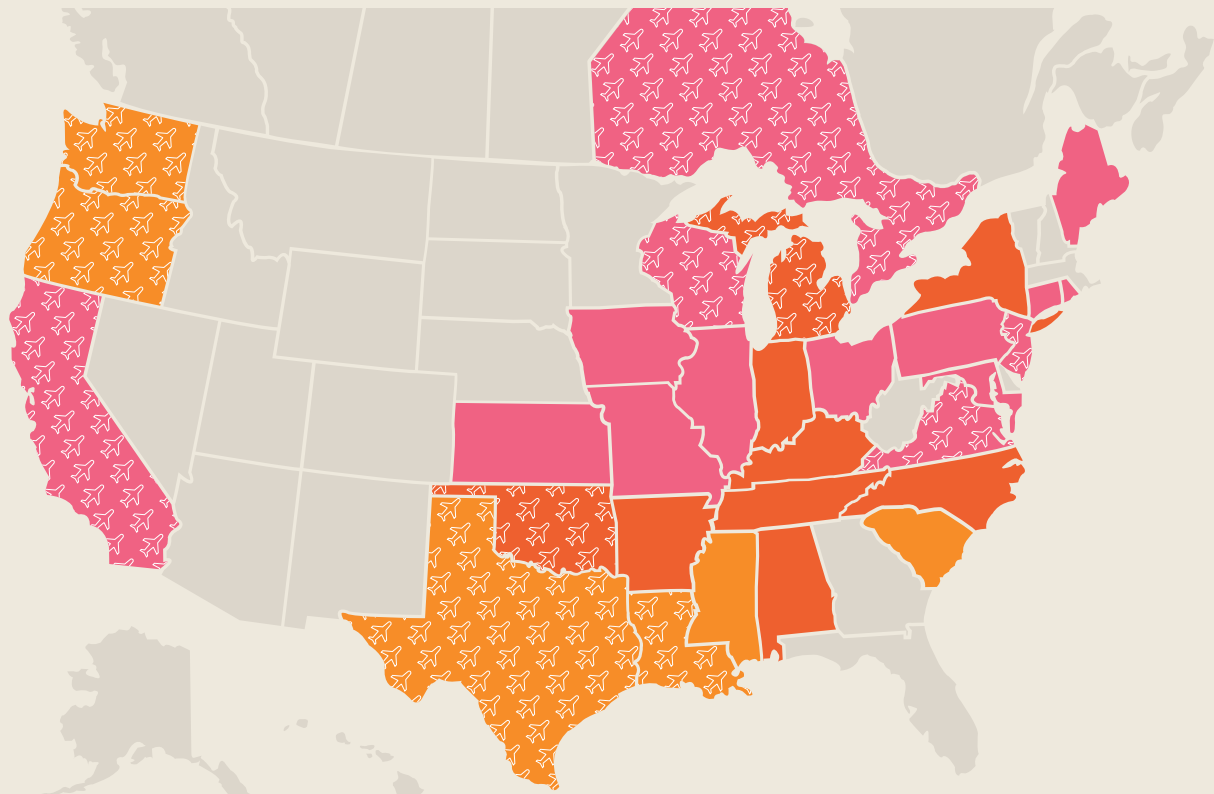


Punky Punkin's Second Chance

In January 2021, BPF met Punky Punkin at the Humane Society of the Delta in Arkansas, where she was tucked away in a storage room—her back legs were paralyzed, and she was reactive toward humans, having never known love. Fortunately, she got her second chance during our transport of 240 pets to 16 organizations and made her way to Cascades Humane Society in Michigan. After being lovingly rehabilitated, Punky's foster family adopted her. Now she can swim and jump in the car!

Transporting Pets to Safety Across the Country

By transporting adoptable pets from overcrowded shelters—mainly in the South—to rescue partners with adopters seeking pets, the pets find homes, and lives are saved. BPF has created a critical network to support shelters that previously had nowhere else to turn.

Saving Lives through Spay/Neuter

BISSELL Pet Foundation’s grant funding makes it possible for hundreds of trusted partner organizations to spay/neuter tens of thousands of pets each year. BPF grants allow shelters to both safely spay and neuter pets before adopting them out to families and provide these important services to their community members. This key strategy to end pet homelessness prevents unwanted litters and dramatically decreases the number of pets entering shelters. BPF continues to prioritize this lifesaving program to address the root cause of overpopulation but we cannot meet the need. Each year, we receive far more grant requests than we can fund—your support can help us do more.

Community Spay/Neuter Clinics

Many shelters, especially in rural areas, are continuously overflowing with homeless pets, reflecting the lack of access to spay/neuter in their communities. To address this ongoing crisis, BPF sponsors high-impact community spay/neuter clinics to help pet owners care for their pets and ultimately ease the burden on the local shelter.



Protecting Communities with Vaccines

In 2021, BPF began a vaccine initiative to protect shelter pets and community pets from needlessly contracting life-threatening illnesses, such as distemper, parvo and rabies. By providing vaccines to shelters that cannot afford them and offering free vaccine clinics to underserved communities, BPF is ensuring healthier shelter populations and healthier family pets. This year, BPF granted \$55,816 in vaccine support, including free clinics for hundreds of families in Arkansas, Louisiana, Michigan, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Texas. With your help, we can reach more communities in 2022.

High-Impact Initiatives

Amarillo Vaccine Clinic

While BPF hosted numerous free clinics in 2021, one of the largest was in Amarillo, Texas. In partnership with the City of Amarillo Animal Welfare & Management, **BPF paid for and supplied vaccines for 716 pets during this multi-week event in August and September.** Organizers and volunteers from local veterinary clinics, vet schools, and the community arranged a drive-up clinic to ensure social distancing. Thanks to this clinic, pets will be healthier and outbreaks will decrease.



2020 | BPF joins nation #SpayTogether coalition to provide large-scale spay/neuter relief during Covid pandemic

Arkansas Spay/Neuter Clinic

In May of this year, BPF organized and sponsored a free clinic to make spay/neuter, vaccinations, microchips and heartworm treatment accessible for the people of Helena / West Helena, AR, a rural community in need. Cars lined up around the parking lot before the 7 am start time, and over three days, **222 pets – 137 dogs and 85 cats – were spayed/neutered.** With the need exceeding the clinic’s capacity, BPF gave vouchers for free procedures to over 120 additional people for future use.



Making an Impact Around the Globe

BISSELL Pet Foundation is quickly expanding our aid of homeless pets internationally, with our spay/neuter grants now impacting parts of Australia, Germany, The Netherlands, and The United Kingdom. These grants have impacted 3,729 pets overseas since September 2020 and funded Australia’s first-ever Trap, Neuter and Return program.

Disaster Relief

BPF is ready to help in times of crisis. We aim to be a dependable resource for our partner organizations facing devastating natural disasters and to save pets endangered by life-threatening events. In urban and rural areas, shelters of all sizes turn to BPF, knowing we will react quickly in situations requiring an immediate response.



BPF's National Shelter Alliance

2021 saw the launch of BISSELL Pet Foundation's National Shelter Alliance, a collaborative effort between BPF, 50 leading shelters from 31 states, and Code 3 Associates, who specialize in disaster response. Alliance members work together to support shelters in need, provide expertise during a crisis and respond to disaster and cruelty situations. Our Alliance membership is growing quickly, with a goal to reach every state to expand our impact.

Saying Yes to Emergencies

Urgent Rescue

As part of the emergency response effort, BPF assists with puppy mills, hoarding situations, and cruelty cases. We fund the evacuations of pets in deplorable conditions to shelter partners throughout the country where necessary medical attention is given to the rescued pets.



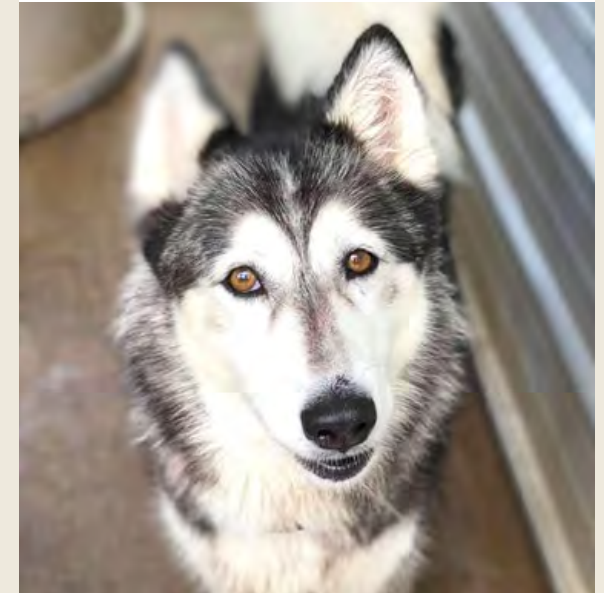
Hurricane Ida Relief

Hurricane Ida devastated parts of Louisiana and Mississippi, with shelters and rescues alike coping with displaced pets, loss of food and storm damage. BPF, along with partners Code 3 Associates and Humane Society of Tulsa, helped more than 500 impacted pets before, during and after the storm.



El Paso Overcrowding Crisis

This summer, BPF assisted the City of El Paso Animal Services, a municipal shelter struggling with extreme overcrowding. To address the crisis, BPF transported 326 pets by air; sponsored multiple Empty the Shelters events; and hosted a free community vaccination clinic helping 450 dogs and 100 cats.

Grateful Pets: Meet Belladonna

BPF Grateful Pets receive funding up to \$2,500 for medical or behavioral care to help them get adopted. One such Grateful Pet, Belladonna, was in critical condition with a long-neglected prolapsed rectum and uterus when she was surrendered to Animal Aid for Vermilion Area in Louisiana. BPF supported her surgery, and we are happy to report she has since recovered and is available for adoption.

Feed the Shelters

Shelters across the country often struggle to keep the hundreds of pets in their care fed each day. Whether it's due to budget constraints or an emergency, BISSELL Pet Foundation receives numerous requests for help with food. **In just two years, BPF and our Feed the Shelters program have provided 1,592,618 meals to hungry pets!**

This year, we kept pets' bowls full with 48 shelters in 31 states and Canada receiving grants for food in spring and summer. Thanks to generous donations from Central Garden & Pet and Purina, we were able to extend our assistance to 15 more shelters during times of crisis in the fall. In 2021 alone, BPF delivered 1,228,324 meals!

Healing Heartworm

A dog with heartworm is just like any other dog – they love to play, snuggle, and have fun. Unfortunately, due to the high cost of treatment, many heartworm-positive shelter dogs are overlooked by adopters, are not desirable for transport to other shelters, and never get help. **In 2021, BPF launched the Healing Heartworm program to save 1,213 pets with the disease and prevent thousands more from contracting it.**

First, destination shelters taking in pets from our transport operations receive funding to treat heartworm-positive dogs. Second, we are proactively supporting 11 shelters committing to transport and treat 1050 heartworm-positive dogs from our southern shelter partners in need. Finally, we are distributing 11,000 doses of preventative medicine to stop future heartworm from occurring. Heartworm is entirely treatable, and we are thrilled to save so many dogs that otherwise would have been left behind.

“Heartworm is a big, potentially fatal problem for dogs in animal shelters in the South. It drains the life force of dogs in shelters and the hope from the staff and volunteers who care for them. It breaks hearts physically and emotionally. BISSELL Pet Foundation’s Healing Heartworm Program saves those lives and restores hope. It is a great privilege for us to be a part of this bold initiative.”

Meet Pluto!

In July, the BPF team met Pluto at Beauregard Parish Animal Shelter in Louisiana. We transported all the pets out of this underserved, rural shelter, and while each pet is incredibly special, Pluto captured Cathy's heart. While loading the pets onto the cargo plane for transport, Cathy felt compelled to provide extra care for Pluto and arranged for him to be taken to Harbor Humane Society near BPF headquarters in Michigan. After he tested heartworm positive, BPF awarded a Healing Heartworm grant to the shelter to begin treatment immediately. We're happy to report he has since recovered, and because the cost of treatment was not a barrier, Pluto was adopted by a loving family.

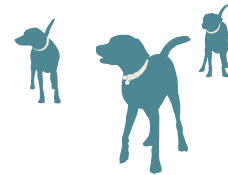
